

Conference **Plans**

Let me begin my message about plans for the next ISOES Conference. The Executive committee decided to skip 2006 because of the belief that many

members will be attending the International **Ergonomics Association Conference this** summer in the Netherlands. Not too many people have the time and budget to attend two conferences during the same summer, and many of those who do would not have enough quality papers to share at both conferences. We discussed that plan with members in the annual membership meeting during the 2005 conference in Las Vegas, and received general concurrence and no opposition to the plan. So we plan to hold our next ISOES Conference in the summer of 2007. Our Conference Planning committee is currently looking into possible sites in Boston. We expect to announce dates and location by early this summer.

Sustaining the Society

ISOES functions through the volunteer efforts of members, and now is the time to volunteer. A Call for Nominations is in this Newsletter. We have openings for four positions on the Executive Council. Members may nominate a colleague or volunteer. Participation is

a rewarding experience that helps develop recognition and leadership skills. Aside from personal benefits, serving as an officer provides an opportunity to help with a reminder sustain the vitality of the growing occupational safety and ergonomics community.

> Our Society provides a forum for the many professionals with an interest in occupational ergonomics, occupational safety, or both. No other society or association in the world provides a more seamless integration of the two areas. My underlying reason for volunteering to serve this Society is to help advance the perspective that the two fields are complementary, and perhaps even inseparable. For example, when a worker is injured from a fall, the traditional perspective is to call it an event in the realm of occupational safety. But as we examine the root causes of most falls, we recognize that the human-environment interrelationships leading to the incident as part of the realm of ergonomics. Another example is occupational back troubles. Sprains and strains often results from a single incident in the realm of safety, while spinal damage is generally recognized as a cumulative trauma disorder in the realm of ergonomics. Personally, I hope to see the traditional distinctions between safety and ergonomics diminish as people begin to appreciate how the two fields are complementary and interrelated. That's my personal reason for supporting our unique Society. Other members, and officers, have different reasons.



Call for Award Nominations

All members of ISOES are encouraged to nominate someone for an award. Awards authorized in the Bylaws are: Distinguished Achievement Award, Outstanding Occupational Ergonomics and Safety Application, Honorary Member, and Certificate of Recognition.

The **Distinguished Achievement Award** is for an individual with a distinguished career full of achievements in occupational ergonomics and/or safety. One award per year is authorized. Membership in ISOES is a plus, but not required.

The award for **Outstanding Occupational Ergonomics and Safety Application** is for an individual or group responsible for the achievement. One award per year is authorized. Membership in ISOES is not required.

The award of **Honorary Member** is for both members and non-members of ISOES. Those selected will receive a Certificate of Recognition. A non-member will be granted the privileges and rights of a Full Member for five years; without being required to pay dues. More than one award may be made each year.

The **Certificate of Recognition** is a flexible award. It is for Honorary Members and others who deserve recognition for a special contribution. Membership in ISOES is not required.



Journal Editor's Message: Patrick Dempsey

One characteristic of the editorial structure of *Occupational Ergonomics* that I believe will result in efficient and high quality reviews is the appointment of Scientific Editors that have a breadth of expertise. Not only does this reduce the individual burden placed on editors, which is one of the most unrequited labors in science, but it also



puts the decision and referee process in the hands of experts closer to the subject matter than can be provided by a single editor. For this reason, I have sought out Scientific Editors with significant expertise and publication records in combination with a shared ambition to provide authors with timely and fair decisions on submissions. I could not be happier that Drs. Lex Burdorf (Erasmus University, The Netherlands) Raoul Grönqvist (Finnish Institute of Occupational Health, Finland), Gary Mirka (North Carolina State University, USA) and Maury Nussbaum (Virginia Tech, USA) have agreed to serve as Scientific Editors. This is a formidable team of internationally recognized scientists, and I am hoping to reach agreement shortly with editors to cover the area of organizational design and macroergonomics, as well as cognitive ergonomics that will complete the team. The International Editorial Board is being established, with a focus on members that have a record of providing high quality reviews in a timely fashion. The Scientific Editors and I will rely on these members to provide the core of the reviews for the journal. Finally, Jia-Hua Lin (Liberty Mutual Research Institute for Safety, USA) has agreed to

serve as Book Reviews and Information Editor to keep the membership abreast of important developments and news pertaining to the practice and science of ergonomics. I look forward to receiving your submissions!
