# **New President's Message from Tom Leamon**

## Dear Colleagues:

It is no well kept secret that our Society has not been overly active for the past months - indeed you might agree that moribund would be a more appropriate description. As an entirely volunteer Institution this phase is probably inevitable from time to time and a phase shared by many such organizations, driven as we are by a commitment rather than supported by significant membership dues. As such it is not inappropriate for us to take stock, to look towards the future possibilities rather than endlessly analyzing the past and NOW is the time for us to do this for ISOES.

But first where are we? We have, belatedly I admit, successfully completed an election and I am privileged to be writing to you as President. The rest of the elected officers are detailed elsewhere in this newsletter. The slate which we were elected from was one drawn up – may be even harassed – from a group of individuals committed to the future of the Society and a shared professional commitment to an area of endeavor not adequately sustained by any other organization – Occupational Ergonomics and Safety. I claim this, without detailing the evidence of many discussions and moans which I have heard -- and shared -- in conference halls and receptions of several major Societies – discussions which do not normally feature in published reports and newsletters.

The question we must face is:

How many of you believe that the contribution that occupational ergonomics and safety activities (including research, applications and practice) can make to the health and safety of workers, where ever they are, and to the economic viability of both developed and developing enterprises is significant, is in your own area of expertise and interest and is worth supporting?

The next 24 months will see the answer to my question, but I would so welcome your comments – agreeing or not – and any input or advice you can offer your Council.

Our analysis has led us to define several actions which you should be aware of – and which I hope you will find interesting enough to comment on:

We recognize the need to provide professional value to you and we will do this in three ways:

First, we have arranged the 2008 Annual Conference details of which – including the call for papers is in this edition of the news letter.

Second, we will produce informative newsletters *on time* for the next two years.

Third, we will generate a 24 month action plan within the current year for wide discussion and evaluation by you, including the timely election of the next Council.

We also recognize that the fee/value proposition is not appropriate **for the current level of activity**. We have thus revised the membership dues, **temporarily** reducing the annual amount for the next two years, introducing a student reduced membership and providing a modest reduction for a two year renewal.

While I hope you are in agreement with these steps – I can understand that you might think – from your own situation – that these are too modest. If you think this - then the answer is in your own hands. Contact us with you ideas. Offer to help. Run for office.

The reason you may not do any of these things will probably involve several fears: your ideas may not be welcome, you will be sucked into a commitment you can ill afford, all the members of the Council are part of an old boys network which will freeze out any new comer – or you are just too new to the game to be welcome or that your interest in OE&S is not the main part of your job.

My answer to you is this:

If any of these reasons are true then your Council is deluded and doomed to failure.

We agreed to run for council because we believe in the domain, we all could use the time elsewhere, we have tried and will continue to try to run the leanest operation in our power to maintain the only professional home dedicated to the symbiosis of Occupational Ergonomics and Safety.

Ultimately the success of SOEIS will be your success and will result from you contribution, even the most modest input will add vitality to our efforts and will, we believe, reward the contributor at that important interface between personal and professional life. Help us to work together to achieve success.


